Large Variety of Products

A large variety of agricultural products, which are suited to the natural features of each region, are grown throughout the year in Gifu Prefecture. In the Gifu and Seino regions, tomatoes, spinach, and persimmons are grown. Rice is cultivated in the plains of southwestern Gifu due to the warm climate in the region. Summer-autumn tomatoes, as well as summer radishes are grown in the Chuno and Tono regions. Vegetables, including summer-autumn tomatoes and summer spinach are produced in the cooler summer climate of the high altitude plateaus in the Hida Region. In addition, beef cattle are raised and dairy farming is conducted in the mountain areas. In the fishing industry, river fisheries and aquaculture are conducted mainly for ayu (sweetfish) and trout.
